Tonight's service is in two parts:

- 1. the Vigil, whereby we recall God's saving actions across time; and
- 2. the Service of Light, in which we acclaim the resurrection, focused around the Easter light.

THE VIGIL

A fire is lit

Lighten our darkness, Lord, we pray, and in your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night, for the love of your only Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

This is the night in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life. The Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather wherever they are in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which through word and sacrament we share in his victory over death.

As we await the risen Christ, let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, recalling how he saved his people in ages past and in the fullness of time sent his Son to be our Redeemer. Let us pray that through this Easter celebration God may bring to perfection, in each of us, the saving work he has begun.

First reading: Genesis 1.1-2.4a
The song of the goodness of God's creation

<u>Taizé chant</u> Bless the Lord my soul.

Let us pray that we may see God's image restored.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation. Your love cannot be contained and overflows in the wonder of creation. You formed the universe out of nothing and moulded us from the clay of the earth. All you have made sings of your marvellous deeds, O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

<u>Second reading: Genesis 22.1-18</u> Abraham and Isaac - the sacrifice and the blessing

Taizé chant

The Lord is my light, my light and salvation: in God I trust, in God I trust.

Let us pray that we may have the courage and strength to make the sacrifices our faith demands.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation. Through the faithfulness of Abraham all the children of earth are blessed.

Give us the courage to give up to you those things that are most precious to us, that in turn we may receive the honour and the joy of your blessing, O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

Third reading: Exodus 12.1-24

The Passover - the blood of the lamb protects God's people from death

Taizé chant

Within our darkest night, you kindle a fire that never dies away, never dies away.

Let us pray that God will feed and sustain his people through the hard journeys of this life.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation. With the dawning of their deliverance your people ate the feast of freedom.

As Christ our Passover Lamb gives hope to the hopeless and frees the ensnared, Establish the justice for which your heart yearns, O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

<u>Fourth reading: Exodus 13.21; 14.10-31</u> Crossing the Red Sea - escaping slavery to be free to respond to God's blessing

Taizé chant

The Lord is my light, my light and salvation: in God I trust, in God I trust.

Let us pray that God will give freedom to his enslaved people.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation. You heard the agony of your people as they cried out from their slavery, and you gave them Moses to lead them to a land flowing with milk and honey. Hear the cry of the enslaved and the homeless today and lead us through the turbulent sea of life to our true home with you, O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

Fifth reading: Jeremiah 31.31-34 God promises a new covenant, of the heart

Taizé chant

Within our darkest night, you kindle a fire that never dies away, never dies away.

Let us pray that God will rekindle in us a renewed love for him.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation. Even when your people broke your covenant, your heart cried out for them and you remained steadfast as a faithful husband. Renew in us our love for you and write your law on our hearts, that we may truly be your people, and you our God, O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

Sixth reading: Ezekiel 36.24-28
Sprinkled clean, and given a new heart

Taizé chant

Bless the Lord my soul, and bless God's holy name. Bless the Lord my soul, who leads me into life.

Let us pray that God will give to the thirsting a new outpouring of his refreshing spirit.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation. When we are overwhelmed by the wasting world, gather us again and renew us.

Create in us a new heart and a renewed spirit, that we may be a people prepared to live in your land and walk in your ways, O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

Seventh reading: Ezekiel 37.1-14

The valley of dry bones - God promises to put his spirit within us

Taizé chant

The Lord is my light, my light and salvation: in God I trust, in God I trust.

Let us pray that God will breathe new life into his weary creation.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation. You bring life from the darkest valley of death. When hope is lost and our dry bones are scattered in shame, speak your word to your broken people, that we may stand confidently before you, and breathe your Spirit into us that we might live, O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

Eighth reading: Ezekiel 47.1-12
The river of the water of life

Taizé chant

Bless the Lord my soul, and bless God's holy name. Bless the Lord my soul, who leads me into life.

Let us pray that God's justice will flow like rivers in the deserts of this world.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation.
The river of life flows from your heart
and where that stream goes everything bursts into flower.
May your refreshing water
be a torrent of life in the deserts of this world,
bringing food to eat and healing to the nations,
O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT

Eternal God,

who made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light: set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Easter Candle is marked in prayer

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and for ever. **Amen.**

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us. **Amen.**

The Easter Candle is lit from the fire

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, the unseen God, the Father Almighty, and your only Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who has ransomed us by his death, and paid for us the price of Adam's sin. For this is the Passover of that true Lamb of God, by whose blood the homes of all the faithful are hallowed and protected. This is the night when of old you saved our ancestors, delivering the people of Israel from their slavery, and leading them dry-shod through the sea. This is the night when Jesus Christ vanquished hell and rose triumphant from the grave. This is the night when all who believe in him are freed from sin and restored to grace and holiness. Most blessed of all nights, when wickedness is put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained and mourning turned to joy. Night truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth and all creation reconciled to God! Therefore, Heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, accept our sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering; and grant that this Easter candle may make our darkness light; for Christ the Morning Star has risen, never again to set, and is alive and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

Alleluia. Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Taizé gloria

Gloria, gloria, in excelsis deo. Gloria, gloria, alleluia, alleluia.

Let us pray that we may reign with the risen Christ in glory.

God of glory, by the raising of your Son you have broken the chains of death and hell: fill your Church with faith and hope; for a new day has dawned and the way to life stands open in our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from Paul's letter to the church in Rome:

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Romans 6.3-11

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Psalm 114

- When Israel came out of Egypt: and the house of Jacob from among a people of an alien tongue,
- Judah became his sanctuary: and Israel his dominion.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Mark 16.1-8

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, 'Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you.' So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

This is the Gospel of the Lord, praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

who filled the disciples with the life of the risen Lord, empower you and fill you with Christ's peace. **Amen.**

And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

With the risen life of Christ within you, go in the peace of Christ. Alleluia, alleluia.
