GATHERING IN GOD'S NAME

Bless the Lord who forgives all our sins whose mercy endures for ever.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Tonight we begin the Great Three Days of our Lord's passion, death and resurrection, the journey from the supper table to the cross, from the cross to Easter dawn. We are followers in his way, exploring his truth, encountering his life.

This is the night when Christ the Lamb of God gave himself into the hands of those who would betray him

This is the night when Christ gathered with his disciples in the upper room.

This is the night when Christ our Lord gave us this holy feast, that as we break the bread and drink the cup we may here proclaim his holy sacrifice, and come to his table in heaven.

This is the night when Christ took a towel and washed the disciples' feet, showing us how to honour and serve one another in love.

This is the night for watching and prayer.

We give ourselves freely to the demands of these great days, confident that those who die in Christ will surely live with him.

This familiar hymn serves as an introduction to the different aspects we will observe in tonight's service: unity in love, the Last Supper, the washing of feet, and then departing - open to whatever follows.

- An upper room did our Lord prepare for those he loved until the end: and his disciples still gather there to celebrate their risen friend.
- A lasting gift Jesus gave his own: to share his bread, his loving cup.
 Whatever burdens may bow us down, he by his cross shall lift us up.
- And after supper he washed their feet, for service, too, is sacrament.
 In him our joy shall be made complete – sent out to serve, as he was sent.
- 4. No end there is! We depart in peace.
 He loves beyond the uttermost:
 in every room in our Father's house
 he will be there, as Lord and host.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from Exodus 12.1-4, 11-14

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbour in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it.

This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgements: I am the Lord. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

May your word live in us, and bear much fruit to your glory.

Psalm 116.1-2, 11-18

- ¹ I love the Lord, because he heard my voice: the voice of my supplication;
- Because he inclined his ear to me: in the day that I called to him.
- How shall I repay the Lord: for all his benefits to me?
- 12 I will take up the cup of salvation: and call upon the name of the Lord.
- 13 I will pay my vows to the Lord: in the presence of all his people.
- ¹⁴ Grievous in the sight of the Lord: is the death of his faithful ones.
- O Lord, I am your servant, your servant and the child of your handmaid: you have unloosed my bonds.
- 16 I will offer you a sacrifice of thanksgiving: and call upon the name of the Lord.

A reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians 11.23-26

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St John 13.1-17, 31b-35

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betrav him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, 'Lord, are you going to wash my feet?' Jesus answered, 'You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand.' Peter said to him, 'You will never wash my feet.' Jesus answered, 'Unless I wash you, you have no share with me.' Simon Peter said to him, 'Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!' Jesus said to him, 'One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you.' For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, 'Not all of you are clean.'

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, 'Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them.

'Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, "Where I am going, you cannot come." I give you a

new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord, praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Homily

THE WASHING OF FEET

While we would normally invite everyone to come forward for their feet to be washed, current Covid regulations require each person to be provided with a fresh bowl of warm water and soap - which is not practical.

In the same way that the Gospel particularly describes the interaction between Jesus and one disciple when Jesus washes their feet, so you are invited participate vicariously with the one parishioner having their feet washed on behalf of everyone.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

In the power of the Spirit let us pray to the Father through Christ the Saviour of the world.

Father,

on this, the night he was betrayed, your Son Jesus Christ washed his disciples' feet. We commit ourselves to follow his example of love and service.

Humble us, and in your mercy

hear our prayer.

On this night, he prayed for his disciples to be one. We pray for the unity of your Church. Unite us, and in your mercy

hear our prayer.

On this night, he prayed for those who were to believe through his disciples' message.

We pray for the unity of your Church.

Unite us, and in your mercy

hear our prayer.

On this night, he commanded his disciples to love, but suffered rejection himself.

We pray for the rejected and unloved.

Fill us with your love, and in your mercy

hear our prayer.

On this night, he reminded his disciples that if the world hated them it hated him first. We pray for those who are persecuted for their faith. Give us your peace, and in your mercy

hear our prayer.

On this night, he accepted the cup of death and looked forward to the new wine of the kingdom.

We remember those who have died in the peace of Christ.

Welcome all your children into paradise, and in your mercy

hear our prayer.

Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers.

Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

in Jesus you became the Lamb

who takes away the sins of the world,

and the living bread,

broken for the life of your children.

Come among us in the power of your Holy Spirit,

that your people,

as fragile and fitful as your disciples,

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Blessed and broken God, be among your people

who taste the bitter herbs

of slavery and oppression;

be close to your children who are poured out

in grief and despair;

remake the church, your Son's body,

where it is broken by discord,

dispute and disease;

and renew your creation

in the joy of thanksgiving.

Spread your table

in the face of friends and enemies.

that all may know your peace

and gather in the company of your saints,

to worship you Father, in the presence of Christ

and the companionship of the Holy Spirit,

in songs of never-ending praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power are yours for ever and ever. Amen.

As our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray,

Our Father in heaven,

hallowed be your name,

your kingdom come,

your will be done,

on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins

as we forgive those who sin against us.

Save us from the time of trial

and deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power,

and the glory are yours

now and for ever. Amen.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD AND THE COMMUNION

Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains just a single grain;

but if it dies it bears much fruit.

If we have died with him, we shall live with him.

Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us. Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us your peace.

Come let us take this holy sacrament of the body and blood of Christ in remembrance that he died for us, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

Please come forward to receive the consecrated bread only - or a blessing - queueing up behind each other on the carpet marks, and keeping your distance from others.

STRIPPING THE ALTAR

Let us pray.
Holy God, source of all love
on this night of betrayal
Jesus commanded his disciples
to love one another as he loved them.
We thank you for feeding us in this supper.
Give us the will to serve others
as he was servant of all.

While Psalm 88 is read, the altar is stripped - reminding us of the stripping of Jesus for his crucifixion, and the emptiness of Good Friday - and the lights are turned off, reminding us of the darkness that Jesus entered into on the cross.

Psalm 88

- O Lord my God, I call for help by day: and by night also I cry out before you.
- Let my prayer come into your presence: and turn your ear to my loud crying.
- For my soul is filled with trouble: and my life has come even to the brink of the grave.
- I am reckoned among those that go down to the Pit: I am as one that has no help.
- I lie among the dead, like the slain that sleep in the grave: whom you remember no more, who are cut off from your power.
- You have laid me in the lowest Pit: in darkness and in the watery depths.
- Your wrath lies heavy upon me: and all your waves are brought against me.
- You have put my friends far from me: and made me to be abhorred by them.
- ⁹ I am so fast in prison I cannot get free: my eyes fail because of my affliction.
- Lord, I call to you every day:I stretch out my hands toward you.
- Will you work wonders for the dead: or will the shades rise up again to praise you?
- Shall your love be declared in the grave: or your faithfulness in the place of destruction?
- Will your wonders be made known in the dark: or your righteousness in the land where all things are forgotten?
- But to you, Lord, will I cry: early in the morning my prayer shall come before you.
- O Lord, why have you rejected me: why do you hide your face from me?
- 16 I have been afflicted and wearied from my youth upward:
 - I am tossed high and low, I cease to be.

- Your fierce anger has overwhelmed me: and your terrors have put me to silence.
- They surround me like a flood all the day long: they close upon me from every side.
- ¹⁹ Friend and acquaintance you have put far from me: and kept my companions from my sight.
