Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St John 6.1–21

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming towards him, Jesus said to Philip, 'Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?' He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going

to do. Philip answered him, 'Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, 'There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?' Jesus said, 'Make the people sit down.' Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, 'Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost.' So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, 'This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world.' When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.

When evening came, his disciples went down to the lake, got into a boat, and started across the lake to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. The lake became rough because a strong wind was blowing. When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the lake and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. But he said to them, 'It is I; do not be afraid.' Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land towards which they were going.

This is the Gospel of the Lord,

A reading from the letter to the church in Ephesus, chapter 3.

God's Secret Plan Unveiled at Last*

This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles— for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given to me for you, and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy

apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow-heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given to me by the working of his power.

Wisdom for the Rulers

Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him. I pray therefore that you may not lose heart over my sufferings for you; they are your glory.

God's Love, God's Power - In Us

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen.

May your word live in us,

and bear much fruit to your glory.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

After supper, he took the cup, and again giving you thanks he gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Drink from this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded: proclaiming his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again, we celebrate, with this bread and this cup, his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world.

As we eat and drink this holy sacrament, renew us by your Spirit that we may be united in the body of your Son and serve you as a royal priesthood in the joy of your eternal kingdom.

we worship you in songs of never-ending praise:

Barbara Mills' memorial service

A decision will be made regarding Elizabeth's mother's service, once we have clarity about the Covid regulations that will apply on Friday.

Currently only 10 mourners are allowed to attend, which is not enough to allow for all of Barbara's immediate family. However, 30th July is also the first anniversary of her passing, from the coronavirus.

We pray for the family in this frustrating situation.

15 August: Feast of Mary, Mother of our Lord

We are combining some activities on this Sunday. There will be one Parish Service at 10am. This will be followed by a Statutory Parish Meeting as detailed below. We will then hopefully enjoy a parish luncheon together - details to be advised.

The <u>Parish Governance Act (2013)</u> (PGA) provides the regulations for each parish to be governed. <u>Schedule 1</u> of the PGA provides the <u>Parish Rules for Meetings and Officers</u>.

The default option for rule 10 currently applies to St John's parish council, namely:

- 10. Parish council
 - 10.1 The parish council consists of—
 - (a) the vicar;
 - (b) three churchwardens; and
 - (c) 9 other persons, one-third nominated by the vicar and two-thirds elected by the parishioners.

Our parish council has decided to put the following permitted alternative to a Statutory Parish Meeting for a decision through debate and a vote:

- G.2 Alternative to rule 10.1 (b) and (c)
- (b) three churchwardens; and
- (c) 6 other persons, one-third nominated by the vicar and two-thirds elected by the parishioners.

Note that no parish council can formally change its own numbers. Since the parish council is the legislated representative body of the whole parish, it is the whole parish (or quorum thereof) that must decide.

The motion to be voted on is:

"That the parish adopts the G.2 alternative in Schedule 1 of the Parish Governance Act, changing the number of 'other persons' on the parish council from nine to six."

Maintenance updates

The hot water service for the Fellowship Room kitchen has been replaced, as the old one was leaking and irreparable.

The vestry/sacristy door has been re-secured temporarily with a new lock. For practical reasons this has a different key to the previous lock, and so those who need access to the vestry/sacristy need to arrange to sign the key register and receive the new key.
