#### THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from Deuteronomy 5.1a, 8.7-18

Moses convened all Israel, and said to them:

The Lord your God is bringing you into a good land, a land with flowing streams, with springs and underground waters welling up in valleys and hills, a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey, a land where you may eat bread without scarcity, where you will lack nothing, a land whose stones are iron and from whose hills you may mine copper. You shall eat your fill and bless the Lord your God for the good land that he has given you. Take care that you do not forget the Lord your God, by failing to keep his commandments, his ordinances, and his statutes, which I am commanding you today. When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them, and when your herds and flocks have multiplied, and your silver and gold is multiplied, and all that you have is multiplied, then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. He made water flow for you from flint rock, and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good. Do not say to yourself, 'My power and the might of my own hand have gained me this wealth.' But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today.

May your word live in us, and bear much fruit to your glory.

Of course, there is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped

by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

#### THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.

For you have created the heavens and the earth and formed us in your own image.

In the fullness of time you sent forth your Son, your eternal word, who laid down his life for our salvation

and rose from the grave, the first-fruits of your new creation.

You send forth your holy and life-giving Spirit to give life to our mortal bodies and to renew the face of the earth.

Therefore with all the heavenly hosts, we give voice to everything that you have made, and sing the eternal hymn of praise:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Holy God, we thank you for these gifts of your creation, this bread and wine, and we pray that we who eat and drink them in obedience to our Saviour Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit, may be partakers of his body and blood, and be made one with him and with each other in peace and love.

On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread; and when he had given you thanks he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take, eat. This is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'

After supper, he took the cup, and again giving you thanks he gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Drink from this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded: proclaiming his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again, we celebrate, with this bread and this cup, his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world.

As we eat and drink this holy sacrament, renew us by your Spirit that we may be united in the body of your Son and serve you as a royal priesthood in the joy of your eternal kingdom.

Receive our praises, Father,
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
with whom and in whom,
by the power of the Holy Spirit,
we worship you in songs of never-ending praise:
Blessing and honour and glory and power
are yours for ever and ever. Amen.

hallowed be your name,

## Responding to the lockdown restrictions

Bishop Paul, on behalf of the Archbishop, has joined with other faith leaders in successfully negotiating and pushing back on Covid restrictions where they impact directly on faith communities, and where they might appear to discriminate unfairly.

Sadly, Bishop Paul still receives unkind criticism as though he were the one setting the Victoria State regulations. The reality is that we need to keep all Anglican parishes both as safe as possible to avoid transmitting infection, and also compliant to avoid fines.

While we might not agree with everything our state government is doing, the complexity of our economic and social connections makes the government decision for each aspect appear to be the 'wrong decision' for many people.

The best response is:

- to push back and negotiate respectfully as Bishop Paul is doing for the whole Diocese;
- to keep praying for our political and community leaders at every level (including Fr John) to be blessed with wisdom, compassion, and fortitude to keep going;
- to keep reaching out to others in our family, friendship, and faith circles, finding ways to bless them with kind words and deeds;
- to keep turning to God with prayers of both thanksgiving for the blessings we receive, and supplication for our own and others' needs: the Psalms are a wonderful source for personal prayer in this regard.



## Roadmap out of lockdown

We're hoping to resume services from Sunday 7 November - though this might be delayed.

The Diocese is requesting each parish to cater - as best as each parish can - both for those who are fully vaccinated but vulnerable, and for those who are unvaccinated (regardless of the reason).

Fr John and Meryl Fisher, our CovidSafe Officer, are consulting with Diocesan and Deanery advisors to determine the most viable way forwards. Like some other parishes, we are asking parishioners to respond to a

simple questionnaire to help with planning appropriate opportunities for ALL to worship.

# **Annual Meeting timeline**

The Parish Council has confirmed the date of the Annual Meeting. The timeline to the meeting is:

- electoral roll is revised between 17 Oct and 13 Nov
- 14 Nov deadline for reports for annual meeting
- 21 Nov annual meeting reports distributed
- 25 Nov deadline for nominations for office bearers (if no postal ballot is required)
- · 28 Nov (Advent Sunday) 11.30am Annual Meeting

We will assess early in November whether we will be able to meet in person or not. This is complicated by the desire to cater for people regardless of their vaccination status, but where only a maximum of 20 is permitted when any unvaccinated people are present.

## **Donations to TDRM (The Dining Room Mission)**

The St John's TDRM team has become a significant part of the mission of our parish and now includes more than 20 parishioners who contribute in many ways including cooking, delivering, serving or by making donations of money or ingredients. It is good for us to be reminded of some important aspects of our support for, and involvement in, this significant part of the mission of our parish.

On the second Tuesday of each month the team from St John's cooks and serves the main meal and dessert for the 70+ guests who attend The Dining Room Mission each week. The main ingredients are provided for the cooks by the parish, and to help cover these costs parishioners are asked to make financial donations to St John's for the TDRM team to use for ingredients. Donations of specific ingredients are also called for and TDRM provides items when they are available. This enables a broader participation than just the team, and enables those who cook to be reimbursed, so that they do not need to bear the financial costs as well.

It is important to ensure that this shared parish mission is transparent and accountable, we therefore encourage parishioners to make financial donations through the St John's general account and encourage our cooks to claim reimbursement for any ingredients they purchase. In this way the contributions and the costs can be measured, and this vital mission will be sustainable into the future.

At the same time it is essential that we prioritise meeting the operating costs of our parish since without a financially viable church we will not be able to continue to this and other vital ministries.
