THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from Nehemiah 8.1–3, 5–6, 8–10

All the people gathered together into the square before the Water Gate. They told the scribe Ezra to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had given to Israel. Accordingly, the priest Ezra brought the law before the assembly, both women and men and all who could hear with understanding. This was on the first day of the seventh month. He read from it facing the square before the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of the men and the women and those who could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive to the book of the law.

And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people answered, 'Amen, Amen', lifting up their hands. Then they bowed their heads and worshipped the Lord with their faces to the ground.

So they read from the book, from the law of God, with interpretation. They gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, 'This day is holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn or weep.'

For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. Then he said to them, 'Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our Lord; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.'

A reading from Paul's first letter to the church in Corinth
12.12–31

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all

baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot were to say, 'Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear were to say, 'Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you', nor again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you.' On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honourable we clothe with greater honour, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honour to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it.

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? But strive for the greater gifts.

May your word live in us,

Community meals - Wednesday evenings

We are familiar with the Tuesday evening meal program, run by the independent organisation The Dining Room Mission (TDRM) at St John's over many years. We have a team of over 20 St John's parishioners who currently cook and assist TDRM once a month.

The Wednesday community meal program has been running for not quite as long, but still for a good few years now. Up until last year it was run by two other church communities - Urban Life, and New Community Ringwood - who have found our facilities to be invaluable to those faith communities in enacting the Kingdom of God in this way.

After needing to move away from St John's for 12 months (April 2020 to April 2021), the Wednesday community meal hosts underwent a slight change. New Community Ringwood are continuing on alternate Wednesdays, and the Urban Life slot has been taken over by the *Winter Shelter* program. *Winter Shelter* is a Maroondah area program supported by many local churches to provide places to sleep for homeless men during winter. While this has also been limited by the covid regulations during 2020 & 2021, the program has continued - still under the name of *Winter Shelter* - by offering community meals.

I'm not sure how intentional St John's partnership has been with the Wednesday community meals program in the past - but it is certainly intentional now. We provide our facilities to both TDRM and *Winter Shelter* at the going commercial hire rate, with 100% discount.

This means that part of our offertory given at each service, for which we pray '*Accept and use our offerings for your glory and for the service of your kingdom*', is used to cover utilities used and to make good the inevitable wear and tear resulting from people using our facilities to provide for the needy.

When we see scuff marks that need cleaning, chairs perhaps stacked untidily, and empty toilet paper rolls that

need replacing, these are not things to worry about. Rather, these are good signs that our church facilities are being used to give food and friendship to the hungry, the lonely, and the homeless. These are signs that not only are these guests being blessed in receiving, but also that volunteers from other church communities are being blessed in being able to use St John's facilities to respond to God's love, and share that with others.

What a privilege and blessing it is for us to be supporting these community meals programs intentionally. And what a blessing to be able to promote the Australia Day BBQ taking place on the lawn next Wednesday (see flyer.) Thanks be to God!
