So we welcome you, Hazel, with your sponsors and family.

We give thanks for you, and pray that you may know God's love and faithfulness for ever.

And now we affirm our trust in God's mercy, and confess that we need forgiveness.

Forgive us when we turn away from you.

Lord, have mercy.

Rescue us from slavery to sin.

Lord God, by your Spirit, you restore us to fellowship with you and with one another.

Breathe your love and freedom into our lives.

GLORIA AND COLLECT

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world:

have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned,

and the flame shall not consume you.

For I am the Lord your God,

the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour.

I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, 'Give them up'. and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the eartheveryone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke 3.15–22

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people. But Herod the ruler, who had been rebuked by him because of Herodias, his brother's wife, and because of all the evil things that Herod had done, added to them all by shutting up John in prison. Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord, praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Sermon

THE PRESENTATION

Sponsors (parents & godparents) stand with the candidate.

Children are baptised in response to God's all-embracing love. Parents and godparents who have responded to that love come now to bring their child for baptism. Before this congregation they must express their own trust and commitment to the promises of God, and their intention to bring up their child in the faith and practice of the Church. In due time Hazel should make her own response to God, and be prepared for confirmation.

Will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Hazel for baptism?

Sponsors I will.

Are you willing to answer on behalf of Hazel? Sponsors I am.

By your own prayers and example, by your friendship and love, will you encourage Hazel in the life and faith of the Christian community?

Sponsors I will, with God's help.

THE DECISION

Before God and this congregation, you must affirm that you turn to Christ and reject all that is evil:

Do you turn to Christ?

Sponsors I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

Sponsors I repent of my sins.

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust?

Sponsors I reject them all.

Do you renounce Satan and all evil?

Sponsors I renounce all that is evil.

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**

Let all of us affirm, together with Hazel's sponsors, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in all the world?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

As Hazel's sponsors, will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

Sponsors I will, with God's help.

You have heard these our sisters and brothers respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

We will.

Let us pray.

Grant, merciful God, that Hazel may be so buried with Christ in baptism that the new nature may be raised up in her. May the fruit of your Spirit grow and flourish in her. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

Give to her sponsors and families the desire to share with her what you have revealed in your holy gospel. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

May they know Christ's forgiving love and continue in the fellowship and service of his Church. May they proclaim, by word and example, the good news of God in Christ. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

We pray for the world in which we live, for peace and harmony among all people. Bring healing and wholeness to the sick [especially ...], to those who mourn and to all in need.

God of grace,

hear our prayer.

We thank you for the ministry we have in your world and to each other in the household of faith. Hasten that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in Christ. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

THE BAPTISM

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We give you thanks that at the beginning of creation your Holy Spirit moved upon the waters to bring forth light and life. With water you cleanse and replenish the earth; you nourish and sustain all living things.

Through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery into freedom, and brought them through the river Jordan to new life in the land of promise. We give you thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit. Through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph. We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom.

And now we give you thanks that you have called Hazel to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism.

Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that she who is baptised in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection. May she die to sin, rise to newness of life, and continue forever in Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we give you praise and honour in the unity of the Spirit, now and for ever.

Amen.

AFTER BAPTISM

Hazel, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own for ever. Live as a disciple of Christ:

fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.

Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

A candle lit from the Christ light (Easter candle) is given. God has brought you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

Hazel, God has called you into his Church.

We therefore receive and welcome you

as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.

THE GREETING OF PEACE

In baptism, God has made us one in Christ. **His Spirit is with us.**

Baptism of Hazel Doriean

Today we celebrate not only the Baptism of our Lord, but also baptising Hazel Doriean, who has been attending services over the last few months, along with her mother Carol, and grandmother Gicelle.

Changes in Covid restrictions

"The 2sqm density rule now applies for all indoor refreshments in church facilities including before or after services. Only fully vaccinated people can participate in indoor refreshments. The density limit does not appear to apply to church services."

Consequently, it is currently better to cancel morning tea after the service, than to discriminate or arrange to roster vax certificate checkers at the entry to the Fellowship Room. We will review this decision.

"Numerous parishes in our Diocese have had people, including clergy, test positive - having been in a service

in the days preceding. We advise alerting parishioners to when that happens and reminding people not to attend church if they have any symptoms."

So far at St John's, parishioners have been responsible, and not attended while they have been waiting test results or needing to isolate.
