Tonight's service is in two parts:

- 1. the Service of Light, in which we acclaim the resurrection, focused around the Easter light; and
- 2. the Vigil, whereby we recall God's saving actions across time, and in the light of the Easter revelation.

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

on this most holy night,

when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord. We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries, confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.

Prayer over the fire

Eternal God, who made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light: set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Easter Candle is marked in prayer Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and for ever. **Amen.**

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us. **Amen.**

The Easter Candle is lit from the fire May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The Easter Candle is processed to its stand, all handheld candles are lit from the Easter Candle, and we sing 3 times:

The light of Christ.

Thanks be to God.

THE EXSULTET

- Sing, choirs of heaven! Let saints and angels sing! Around God's throne exult in harmony! Now Jesus Christ is risen from the grave! Salute your King in glorious symphony!
- Sing, choirs of earth! Behold, your light has come! The glory of the Lord shines radiantly! Lift up your hearts, for Christ has conquered death! The night is past, the day of life is here!
- Sing, Church of God! Exult with joy outpoured! The gospel trumpets tell of victory won! Your Saviour lives; he's with you evermore! Let all God's people sound the long Amen!

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, the unseen God, the Father Almighty, and your only Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who has ransomed us by his death, and paid for us the price of Adam's sin. For this is the Passover of that true Lamb of God, by whose blood the homes of all the faithful are hallowed and protected. This is the night when of old you saved our ancestors, delivering the people of Israel from their slavery, and leading them dry-shod through the sea. This is the night when Jesus Christ vanguished hell and rose triumphant from the grave. This is the night when all who believe in him are freed from sin and restored to grace and holiness. Most blessed of all nights, when wickedness is put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained and mourning turned to joy. Night truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth and all creation reconciled to God! Therefore, Heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, accept our sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering; and grant that this Easter candle may make our darkness light; for Christ the Morning Star has risen, never again to set, and is alive and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

THE VIGIL

As we await the risen Christ, let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, recalling how he saved his people in ages past and in the fullness of time sent his Son to be our Redeemer; and let us pray that through this Easter celebration God may bring to perfection, in each of us, the saving work he has begun.

First reading: The song of the goodness of God's creation

A reading from Genesis 1.1-2.4a ...

Hear the word of the Lord. Send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

Christ is the image of the unseen God; through him all things were made.

Almighty God,

you have created the heavens and the earth and made us in your own image: teach us to discern your hand in all your works and your likeness in all your children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. **Amen.**

Second reading: Adam and Eve - the temptation to follow our own desire

A reading from Genesis 3 ...

Hear the word of the Lord. Have mercy on us, O God.

As in Adam all die, so in Christ shall all be made alive.

Heavenly Father, whose blessed Son was revealed to destroy the works of the devil and to make us the children of God and heirs of eternal life: grant that we, having this hope, may purify ourselves even as he is pure; that when he shall appear in power and great glory we may be made like him in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where he is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever, **Amen.**

Third reading: Noah, and the cleansing flood

A reading from Genesis 7.1-5, 11-18; 8.6-19; 9.8-13 ...

Hear the word of the Lord. Our Creator brings order to the chaos in this world.

In baptism we died to sin. In Christ we are raised to life.

Grant, Lord,

that we who are baptized into the death of your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ may continually put to death our evil desires and be buried with him; and that through the grave and gate of death we may pass to our joyful resurrection; through his merits, who died and was buried and rose again for us, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Fourth reading: The burning bush - being called through fire to bring hope to the oppressed

A reading from Exodus 3.1-10 ...

Hear the word of the Lord. Wait patiently for the Lord.

Your faith is tested by fire to the praise and glory of Christ.

God, who in generous mercy sent the Holy Spirit upon your Church in the burning fire of your love: grant that your people may be fervent in the fellowship of the gospel that, always abiding in you, they may be found steadfast in faith and active in service;

through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. Amen.

Fifth reading: Crossing the Red Sea - escaping slavery to be free to respond to God's blessing

A reading from Exodus 13.21; 14.10-31 ...

Hear the word of the Lord. I will sing to the Lord, who has triumphed gloriously.

The Lord is my strength and my might. He has become my salvation.

Lord God our redeemer, who heard the cry of your people and sent your servant Moses to lead them out of slavery: free us from the tyranny of sin and death and, by the leading of your Spirit, bring us to our promised land; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Sixth reading: Jonah and the great fish - God's mercy when we fail to respond to his call

A reading from the prophet Jonah 1.1-2.10 ...

Hear the word of the Lord. With the Lord there is mercy.

Christ has saved us from the pit of death. He brought new life to the world.

Lord of all time and eternity, you opened the heavens and revealed yourself as Father in the baptism of Jesus your beloved Son: by the power of your Spirit complete the heavenly work of our rebirth through the waters of the new creation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Seventh reading: The three young men - saved from the fire

A reading from the prophet Daniel 3.1-28 ...

Hear the word of the Lord.

Blessed is the Lord who does mighty wonders.

When you walk through the waters Christ is with you. We will never be consumed by the flames.

O God,

you know us to be set in the midst of so many and great dangers, that by reason of the frailty of our nature we cannot always stand upright: grant to us such strength and protection as may support us in all dangers and carry us through all temptations; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. **Amen.** <u>Eighth reading: Daniel in the lion's den - placing faith in</u> <u>God's salvation</u>

A reading from the prophet Daniel 6.1-24 ...

Hear the word of the Lord. I will bless the Lord at all times.

The angels closed the lions' mouths. Christ has saved us from the jaws of death.

Almighty Father, whose Son was revealed in majesty before he suffered death upon the cross: give us grace to perceive his glory, that we may be strengthened to suffer with him and be changed into his likeness, from glory to glory; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

EASTER ACCLAMATION AND GLORIA Alleluia. Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Let us pray that we may reign with the risen Christ in glory.

God of glory, by the raising of your Son you have broken the chains of death and hell: fill your Church with faith and hope; for a new day has dawned and the way to life stands open in our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from Paul's letter to the church in Rome 6.3-11:

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

 If Christ had not been raised from death our faith would be in vain, our preaching but a waste of breath, our sin and guilt remain.
 But now the Lord is risen indeed; he rules in earth and heaven: his Gospel meets a world of need in Christ we are forgiven.

- If Christ still lay within the tomb then death would be the end, and we should face our final doom with neither guide nor friend.
 But now the Saviour is raised up, so when a Christian dies we mourn, yet look to God in hope in Christ the saints arise!
- If Christ had not been truly raised his church would live a lie; his name should never more be praised, his words deserve to die.
 But now our great Redeemer lives; through him we are restored; his word endures, his church revives in Christ, our risen Lord.

Alleluia, alleluia.

I am the first and the last, says the Lord, and the living one; I was dead, and behold I am alive for evermore. **Alleluia.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke 25.1-12

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.' Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

This is the Gospel of the Lord, praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

THE PEACE

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then were they glad when they saw the Lord. Alleluia. The peace of the risen Christ be always with you.

And also with you. Alleluia.

Rejoicing in God's creation, as our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.

Let heaven echo, let the earth sing: Jesus is saviour of everything. All those who trust him, Christ will receive; therefore rejoice, obey and believe! Come let us worship him, endlessly sing; Christ is alive and death loses its sting. Sins are forgiven, alleluia! Jesus is risen, alleluia!

BLESSING AND DISMISSAL

God the Father,

by whose love Christ was raised from the dead, open to you who believe the gates of everlasting life. **Amen.**

God the Son,

who in bursting from the grave has won a glorious victory,

give you joy as you share the Easter faith. Amen.

God the Holy Spirit,

who filled the disciples with the life of the risen Lord, empower you and fill you with Christ's peace. **Amen.**

And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

With the risen life of Christ within you, go in the peace of Christ. Alleluia, alleluia. **Thanks be to God. Alleluia, alleluia.**
