THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from the prophecy of Jeremiah 4.11–12, 22–28

At that time it will be said to this people and to Jerusalem: A hot wind comes from me out of the bare heights in the desert towards my poor people, not to winnow or cleanse— a wind too strong for that. Now it is I who speak in judgement against them.

'For my people are foolish, they do not know me;

they are stupid children,

they have no understanding.

They are skilled in doing evil,

but do not know how to do good.'

I looked on the earth, and lo, it was waste and void; and to the heavens, and they had no light.

A reading from Paul's first letter to Timothy 1.1-2, 12-19a

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Saviour and of Christ Jesus our hope,
To Timothy, my loyal child in the faith:
Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life.

To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen. I am giving you these instructions, Timothy, my child, in accordance with the prophecies made earlier about you, so that by following them you may fight the good fight, having faith and a good conscience.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke 15.1–10

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.'

So he told them this parable: 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." The Queen was much-admired and respected by millions of Australians. My prayers are with the King and the Royal family as they grieve the loss of a mother and grandmother. We pray also for the people of the United Kingdom, as they grieve the loss of their beloved Queen.

I give thanks to God for the Queen's life of service and faith to her subjects in Britain and the Commonwealth.

We remember her too as a faithful Christian and leader of the Church of England, whose faith gave her the courage, resilience and her strong ethic of service to others.

We remember with gratitude the grace with which she performed her duties, a steadfast and reassuring figure through decades of tremendous change and times of both hardship and joy.

As a frequent visitor to Australia the Queen had a special place in the hearts of Australians and she leaves behind a truly extraordinary legacy, having touched the lives of so many.

I will be preaching at the Choral Evensong at St Paul's Cathedral on Sunday 11 September 2022 at 6:00pm to celebrate the long life of the Queen. The service will be live streamed.

- Re-imagining the Future, provided by Bishop Paul, gives us ideas about how to process our church's new socioeconomic landscape, and suggests alternative models to seriously consider for the future God might intend for us.
- Our Mission Action Plan and the Missional Pathway - as described in the July sermon series - is another intentional tool to help us deliberately plan how we might continue Christ's mission, and further grow God's Kingdom at and from St John's.

Over the Sundays to come there will be reminders of the seven stages of the Mission Action Plan at the services. We also intend to hold two Saturday morning workshops to which the whole parish is invited to participate:
